Improving immunizations

PROBLEM STATEMENT

Childhood Immunization Status (CIS) of Combination 10 vaccines is 12% (NCQA 2020 minimum \geq 35%). Low compliance rate is primarily due to the flu vaccine component of the Combo 10 vaccines (compliance rate of 9%). Many patients are not returning for the second dose of their flu vaccine.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES / SMART AIM STATEMENT

Increase flu vaccination rates from 9% to 35% for children ages 0 - 2 years old in Merced County by Q3 2021.

IMPORTANCE / BENEFITS

- NCQA goals currently not being met; intervention will improve childhood immunization rates
- Improved childhood health and wellness (patients and within the greater community)
